Nova Scotia Marine Service Technician (MST) Trade Qualifier Qualification Examination Information Workshops

The purpose of the workshops is to provide information to people who have been working full time as marine service technicians, providing service, repair, refit and upgrades to marine vessels, power and sail in the commercial and recreational marine sectors who wish to challenge for a Nova Scotia Marine Service Technician Certificate of Qualification.

Those wishing to challenge the MST certification must demonstrate with documentation that they have at least 12,000 or more hours (approximately 6 years) working full time in the full scope of the new trade. Candidates can write the MST certification exam for a special reduced fee of \$143.85 until July 1st, 2014.
